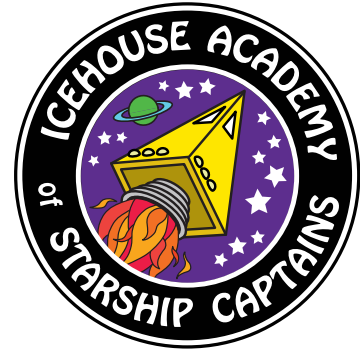

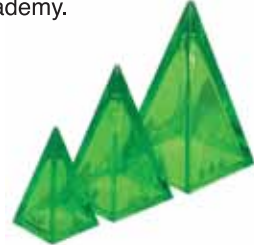

But now your real mission begins: What is YOUR favorite pyramid game? Don't limit yourself to the set you learned here... there's an



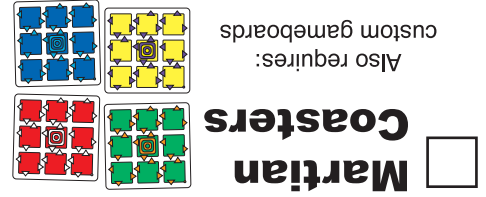

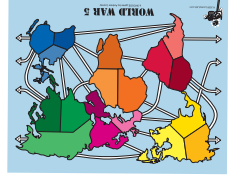
Next, combine the two starter sets and add some other items:

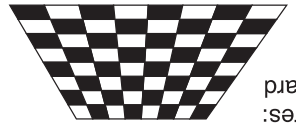

LEXICON

Starship Captain: A fan of the pyramids who knows at least ten games (and has a list of their favorites, ranked according to preference) is known by this fancy title.

Looney Pyramids: This is the general name given to the colorful gaming pyramids sold by Looney Labs. They were invented by Andrew Looney in 1987.

Stash: Some games require many pyramids, others just a few. A set of 15 pyramids (they come in 3 sizes) is called a Stash. If they're all the same color, it's known as a Monochrome Stash.

Rainbow Stash: A stash with pieces of 5 colors: Red, Yellow, Green, Blue, Black.

Xeno Stash: A stash with these colors: Purple, Orange, White, Clear, and Cyan.

Cadet: Anyone who has started to learn pyramid games but hasn't yet learned enough to qualify as a Starship Captain is called a Space Cadet.

Game Tech: Looney Labs, publishers of the pyramids (and card games including Fluxx) refers to their official demo team as Game Technicians.

3HOUSE Set: A set of pyramids made up of 3 Rainbow Stashes, which you can also make by combining the pieces in a Treehouse set and an IceDice set.

Icehouse Academy: Originally, Looney Pyramids were created for a game called Icehouse, and for almost ten years, Icehouse was the only pyramid game. But now we have hundreds of pyramid games to choose from, and the one we invented first is NOT the best place to start. So the Icehouse Academy was created, as a floating school of game instruction.
